SVCE delivers carbon-free electricity at a lower cost than PG&E. PG&E continues to distribute electricity through their existing infrastructure, perform maintenance, billing and customer service, so there is no difference in your utility service or reliability. SVCE was formed by the communities it serves and is governed by a board of directors comprised of one elected representative from each of its participating communities.

SVCE has many resources available to Milpitas residents to help you understand the "Silicon Valley Clean Energy Electric Generation charges" on your PG&E Energy Statement, which first appeared on your July PG&E bill. It's important to note that this new line item on your bill is not a duplicate charge, or an extra charge. SVCE charges REPLACE charges from PG&E, at a lower rate.

Solar customers can learn more about SVCE's generous Net Energy Metering program at https://www.svcleanenergy.org/solar/. Note that solar customers with annual true-ups in the winter and spring are still being enrolled on a special schedule.



Proposition 10 Means Local Control and Stability By Allysson McDonald

New apartments in Milpitas go for over \$3,000 a month. According to an article that appeared in The Mercury News on September 13, even tech workers with six figure incomes can't afford the rent in the Bay Area! A California State law (Costa Hawkins) prevents cities from enacting rent control strategies to protect residents from rising rents. Prop. 10 would repeal that law and allow local control.

In the metro San Jose area (which includes Milpitas), 45 percent of all renter households are "rent burdened," meaning they spend more than 30 percent of their pre-tax income on rent. Many others pay up to 50% or more, making them one paycheck away from homelessness. A Mercury News article on July 3 reported that "rents across the state are up 2.1 percent from last year, continuing a trend that makes California home to some of the most expensive communities for renters."

Voting yes on Proposition 10 in November will repeal Costa Hawkins and give local communities in California the ability to pass rent control laws that will have the effect of stabilizing rents and keeping families in their homes. All families of every economic level will benefit from limits on rent increases so vote yes on Prop 10 in November. For more information, please go to https:// www.housingnowca.org/take-action.




